CARE INSTRUCTIONS

AWM products are built to exacting standards with the highest quality materials. By following some regular care and maintenance practices, your AWM products will enjoy increased longevity.



Workstations, Storage & Joinery

Melamine & Laminate

To maintain melamine and laminate surfaces, use a damp cloth with water or an eco-friendly all-purpose cleaner to remove most spills and marks. While these surfaces are generally resistant to stains, certain substances like beetroot, grape or berry juice, first aid products, concentrated bleach, oven cleaners, dishwasher detergents, hair dyes, artificial dyes, and solvent-based pen ink should be cleaned promptly to prevent staining. Restore the surface's natural brightness by gently rubbing it with a clean, dry cloth.

For longevity, avoid using scourers, abrasives, waxes, or polishes, as they can damage or dull the surface. Strongly acidic, alkaline, or bleach-based cleaners should also be avoided, as they may etch the surface.

Tesrol® Superclean

Tesrol® Superclean features a flat, low-sheen, and low-reflective finish that resists fingerprints from daily use. Clean it with a mild household cleaner and a soft cloth. Avoid cleaners containing abrasives, ammonia, acetone, or solvent-based products.

Timber Veneer and Solid Timber Surfaces

Most marks or spills on timber surfaces can be wiped away with a damp cloth. Promptly clean spills to prevent staining. Avoid using cleaning products on these surfaces.

Since natural timber and its coatings are not heatproof, always use heat-resistant mats or coasters for hot items. To protect surfaces from rubber feet on items like phones or lamps, use a felt mat.

Corian®

Corian® surfaces are easy to clean and maintain. Use a damp sponge or cloth for general cleaning, and soapy water or an ammonia-based cleaner for dirt and grime.

For tougher stains, use a mild abrasive cream or paste cleanser with a non-scratch Scotch-Brite™ pad or damp cloth. Rub in a circular motion, rinse thoroughly, and wipe dry. This method also works for removing light scuff marks.

Metal Surfaces

Clean metal surfaces at least once a year, or more frequently in salt-affected areas. Use a soft, wet sponge to remove deposits, followed by gentle cleaning with a soft, non-abrasive brush and mild detergent. For stubborn stains, use a solvent like isopropyl alcohol or methylated spirits, then rinse with water. Dry all metal surfaces with a soft cloth after cleaning.

Plastic Surfaces

Plastic surfaces require minimal maintenance. Regularly wipe them with a clean, soft cloth, and use a microfiber cloth for dusting. For deeper cleaning, use non-abrasive agents like glass cleaner if a damp cloth isn't sufficient. Greasy marks, such as fingerprints, can be removed with isopropyl alcohol. Avoid rubbing PVC surfaces too hard, as this may damage the finish.

For tambour door units, gently vacuum the sliding tracks regularly to prevent dust and dirt buildup that could damage the wheels.

Upholstered Furniture

Upholstery Fabrics

Vacuum fabrics regularly using low suction and a soft attachment to prevent dirt buildup. Treat spills or stains immediately by gently scraping away solids or blotting liquids. Vacuum the area before cleaning with an eco-friendly upholstery or carpet shampoo. Always test cleaning products on an inconspicuous area first. Avoid using soap, dishwashing liquids, or excessive water.

For stains, clean from the outer edges toward the centre in a circular motion to prevent spreading. Ink stains can be removed by lightly sponging with methylated spirits and blotting the excess. Use sparingly to avoid affecting adhesives beneath the fabric.

Leather Surfaces

The protective pigment finish on leather helps resist stains. Gently remove solids and blot liquids with a soft cloth or paper towel, avoiding pressure that could push the liquid into the leather.

Apply liquid cleaners sparingly to a cloth (not directly to the leather) and clean in a circular motion, working from the outside of the stain inward. Blot away excess cleaner with a clean cloth. When using leather-specific cleaners, follow the manufacturer's instructions carefully. Allow the leather to dry completely before use.
